

Full Text: 2023 New Year Address by President Xi Jinping

BEIJING - On New Year's eve, President Xi Jinping delivered his 2023 New Year Address through China Media Group and the Internet. The following is the full text of the address:

Greetings to you all. The year 2023 is approaching. From Beijing, I extend my best New Year wishes to all of you.

In 2022, we successfully convened the 20th National Congress of the Communist Party of China (CPC). An

ambitious blueprint has been drawn for building a modern socialist country in all respects and advancing the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation on all fronts through a Chinese path to modernisation, sounding a clarion call of the times for us forging ahead on a new journey.

The Chinese economy has remained the second largest in the world and enjoyed sound development. GDP for the whole year is expected to exceed 120 trillion *yuan*. Following a science-based and targeted approach, we have adapted our COVID response in light of the evolving situation to protect the life and health of the people to the greatest extent possible. Officials and the general public, particularly medical professionals and community workers, have bravely stuck to their posts through it all. With extraordinary efforts, we have prevailed over unprecedented difficulties and challenges, and it has not been an easy journey for anyone. We have now entered a new phase of COVID response where tough challenges remain. Everyone is holding on with great fortitude, and the light of hope is right in front of us. Let's make an extra effort to pull through, as perseverance and solidarity mean victory.

Comrade Jiang Zemin passed away in 2022. We pay high tribute to his towering achievements and noble demeanor, and cherish the great legacy he left behind. We will honour his last wishes and advance the cause of socialism with Chinese characteristics in the new era.

Wave upon wave, the mighty river of history surges forward. With the persistent efforts of one generation after another, we have taken China to where it is today.

Today's China is a country where dreams become reality. The Beijing Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games concluded with a resounding success. Chinese winter sports athletes gave their all and achieved extraordinary results. Shenzhou-13, Shenzhou-14 and Shenzhou-15 soared into the heavens. China's space station was fully completed and our "home in space" is roving in the deep-blue sky. The people's armed forces marked the 95th birthday and all service members are marching confidently on the great journey of building a strong military. China's third aircraft carrier Fujian was launched. C919, China's first large passenger aircraft, was delivered. And the Baihetan hydropower station went into full operation... None of these achievements would have been possible without the sweat and toil of the numerous Chinese people. Sparks of talent are coming together, and they are the strength of China!

Today's China is a country brimming with vigour and vitality. Various pilot free trade zones and the Hainan Free Trade Port are booming, innovations are gushing out in the coastal areas, development is picking up pace in the central and western regions, the momentum for revitalisation is building in the northeast, and there is greater development and affluence in the border regions. The Chinese economy enjoys strong resilience, tremendous potential and great vitality. The fundamentals sustaining its long-term growth have remained strong. As long as we stay confident and strive for progress while maintaining stability, we will realise the goals we have set. On my visit to Hong Kong earlier this year, I was deeply glad to see that Hong Kong has restored order and is set to thrive again. With determined implementation of One Country, Two Systems, Hong Kong and Macao will surely enjoy long-term prosperity and stability.

Today's China is a country that keeps to its national character. In the course of 2022, we encountered various natural disasters including earthquakes, floods, droughts and wildfires, and experienced some workplace accidents. Amid those disconcerting and heartbreaking scenes, there have emerged numerous touching stories of people sticking together in face of adversity or even sacrificing their lives to help others in distress. Those heroic deeds will be forever etched in our memories. At every turn of the year, we always think of the great character of resilience that the Chinese nation has carried forward through millennia. It gives us still greater confidence as we continue our way forward.

Today's China is a country closely linked with the world. Over the past year, I have hosted quite a few friends, both old and new, in Beijing; I have also traveled abroad to communicate China's propositions to the world. Changes unseen in a century are unfolding at a faster pace, and the world is not yet a tranquil place. We cherish peace and development and value friends and partners as we have always done. We stand firm on the right side of history and on the side of human civilisation and progress. We work hard to contribute China's wisdom and solutions to the cause of peace and development for all humanity.

After the 20th CPC National Congress, my colleagues and I visited Yan'an. We were there to relive the inspiring episode in which the Party's central leadership overcame extraordinary difficulties in the 1930s and 1940s, and to draw on the spiritual strength of the older generation of CPC members. I often say, "Just as polishing makes jade finer, adversity makes one stronger." Over the past 100 years, the CPC has braved wind and rain, and forged ahead against all odds. That is a most difficult yet great journey. Today, we must press on courageously to make tomorrow's China a better place.

Going forward, China will be a country that performs miracles through hard work. Here I want to quote Su Shi, a renowned Chinese poet, "Charge at the toughest and aim at the farthest." Long as the journey is, we will reach our destination if we stay the course; difficult as the task is, we will get the job done if we keep working at it. As long as we have the resolve to move mountains and the perseverance to plod on, as long as we keep our feet on the ground and forge ahead with our journey by making steady progress, we will turn our grand goals into reality.

Going forward, China will be a country that draws its strength from unity. Ours is a big country. It is only natural for different people to have different concerns or hold different views on the same issue. What matters is that we build consensus through communication and consultation. When the 1.4 billion Chinese work with one heart and one mind, and stand in unity with a strong will, no task will be impossible and no difficulty insurmountable. The people on both sides of the Taiwan Strait are members of one and the same family. I sincerely hope that our compatriots on both sides of the Strait will work together with a unity of purpose to jointly foster lasting prosperity of the Chinese nation.

Going forward, China will be a country that has great expectations of its younger generation. A nation will prosper only when its young people thrive. For China to develop further, our young people must step forward and take on their responsibilities. Youth is full of vigour and is a source of hope. Youngsters should keep their country in mind, cultivate keen enterprise, and live youth to the fullest with great drive, to prove worthy of the times and the splendor of youth.

To the many people who are still busy working at this very moment, I salute you all! We are about to ring in the New Year. Let us welcome the first ray of sunshine of 2023 with the best wishes for a brighter future.

May our country enjoy prosperity and our people live in harmony. May the world enjoy peace and people of all countries live in happiness. I wish you all a happy New Year and may all your wishes come true.

Abstract of Speech by Hussam Al Husseini, Ambassador of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to China



Today, experts from different countries including Jordan gather together to discuss upon sinology studies and ways to strengthen cooperation with the great Chinese civilisation so as to enhance our perception. The history of human being is a history of continued exploration, exchanges and pursuit of wisdom and knowledge, which led to our progress. For thousands of years, the Arabic and Islamic civilisations have gone from North to South and from East to West for exchanges with other civilisations, which brought values to humanity and helped us set our mind free and tap our potentials.

All the great achievements we have made today result from the contribution of each civilisation to humanity. China has been a source of knowledge, philosophy, literature and art for the world since ancient times. And China today is playing a more important role in the development of humanity both in fields of science, technology and innovation and in art, culture and education. China has also become a major economic and strategic cooperative partner for many countries around the world.

We need to enhance our understanding of each other's culture and of cultural values and cultural inheritance. We should discover and recognise the history shared by our civilisations, which will allow us a better future in cutting-edge education.

I feel very proud for the increasing popularity of the Chinese language in my home country Jordan. There are more and more schools and institutions carrying out the education of Chinese language and Chinese culture. At the same time, we have also attracted many Chinese scholars and students to learn Arabic in Jordan.

The world is facing increasing global challenges nowadays. Therefore we should join hands to face them. And to do that, we must promote mutual understanding.

Abstract of Speech by Colin Mackerras, Australian Sinologist, Professor of Griffith University



Prof. Colin Mackerras expounded his understanding of Chinese path in the grand view of history. By analysing the cultural logic behind it, he shared his observation of contemporary China and Chinese modernisation.

He pointed out that with the development and evolution of history and the peaceful rise of China, major changes have taken place in the world in terms of China's voice and influence, which is also the call of the times. From mid twentieth century till now, there's major and continuing shift in the balance of power and influence between the West and other countries in the rest of the world. This shift favours especially China. The historian of the future will undoubtedly see the rise of China as perhaps the greatest global development of the late twentieth century and the twenty-first one.

He argued that the contemporary world is in the era of globalisation, and the US-based globalisation has been in retreat since the world financial crisis of 2008. Since the proposal of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) in 2013, as of August 2022, 149 countries had signed up to its objectives. As a result, China-based globalisation is on a sharp increase. The BRI has the potential to transform the great Eurasian continent for the better in the longer-term future. The spread of Chinese culture could make for a more harmonious and prosperous world in the coming decades.

Abstract of Speech by Carsten Boyer Thøgersen, Former Consul General of Denmark in Shanghai



By introducing the Chinese philosophy "He Er Bu Tong" (harmony but not uniformity) and governance in China, Mr. Carsten Boyer Thøgersen analysed common values in the traditional Chinese culture that can be shared by all humanity, and the Chinese wisdom that cultivated the new form of human advancement.

In his opinion, Carsten believes that different from that in Europe, the governance in China is premised on consensus. The ancient *yin-yang* thinking emphasises harmony and inclusiveness; therefore, harmony but not uniformity serves as a major principle in China's foreign policy.

He said that the US is still a major power in the contemporary world especially in terms of trade, economy, and finance and so on so forth. China needs to maintain steady growth and avoid any possible conflict with it. He is confident that China will keep its own pace to promote international cooperation and achieve win-win result. It is his good wish that the West learn more about China's culture and history and they can work together for a brighter future.

Abstract of Speech by Michael Crook, British Sinologist, Winner of the Chinese Government Friendship Award



Michael Crook, British sinologist and winner of the Chinese Government Friendship Award, made constructive proposals on the interpretation of Chinese modernisation in the new era.

Abstract of Speech by Karim Alwadi, Research Fellow at the Aspen Institute of the United States



Mr. Karim Alwadi, research fellow at the Aspen Institute of the U.S. summarised the new achievements and trends of economic and trade cooperation between Arabic countries and China since the launching of the Belt and Road Initiative and looked into the bright future of China-Arab cooperation.

Mr. Karim Alwadi referred to his experience of visiting the Gulf countries and made the following suggestions to develop China-Arab diplomatic and economic and trade relations: firstly, establish a fast communication channel between state leaders of Arab states and Chinese decision-makers; secondly, strengthen the communication among leading entrepreneurs of China and of Arab states; thirdly, consider to transfer some of China's production capacity to Arab states; fourthly, Arab states can be the best option for China's financing.

Abstract of Speech by Alexey N. Aleksakhin, Vice-Chairman of Russia-China Friendship Association of Russia, Professor of Moscow State Institute of International Relations



In his speech themed Chinese Modernisation, How and Why it matters to the World and Cultural Confidence, Prof. Alexey N. Aleksakhin discussed cultural governance in the context of modernisation from the perspective of global civilisation.

He emphasised that Chinese modernisation is a key word in the report to the 20th National Congress of CPC. As a result, a full understanding of it will facilitate the understanding of China's future development. Chinese modernisation has demonstrated contemporary and worldwide relevance. It will provide valuable reference to Russia in such areas as economy, society and culture etc. He believes that the modernisation of the Chinese language is also a reflection of Chinese modernisation. The simplification of Chinese characters and Chinese phonetic alphabet initiated the new historical process of Chinese modernisation and become an important part of it. The Chinese path to modernisation proposed in the report to the 20th CPC National Congress has chartered a new course for China's future development. Against this background, more attention shall be paid to the Chinese modernisation so as to serve the building of the Chinese path to modernisation.

Abstract of Speech by Rashad S. Karimov, Sinologist from Azerbaijan, Former Chief Adviser for Asian and Foreign Policy at the President's Centre for Strategic Studies of Azerbaijan



Mr. Rashad S. Karimov, Former Chief Adviser for Asian and Foreign Policy at the President's Centre for Strategic Studies of Azerbaijan and a sinologist, started from the concrete practices of the Belt and Road Initiative in Azerbaijan and illustrated the relationship between implementing the Initiative and championing the concept of a community with a shared future for mankind.

Mr. Rashad S. Karimov pointed out that Azerbaijan is an important cooperation country of the Belt and Road Initiative, which provides participating countries with high-quality opportunities of mutually beneficial cooperation and development. Through jointly implementing the Belt and Road Initiative, China contributes Chinese solution and wisdom to the modernisation progress of the world.

According to Mr. Rashad S. Karimov, Chinese modernisation suits the aspiration of people around the world for a better life. Peace, development, cooperation and mutual benefits should be the symbol of human progress. Confrontation and conflict should not be the destiny of humanity. Focusing on the connection between China and the rest of the world, Chinese modernisation adheres to dialogue and consultation to promote the building of a world of lasting peace, adheres to joint contribution and shared benefits to promote the building of a world of universal security, adheres to cooperation and mutual benefits to promote the building of a world of common prosperity, adheres to exchanges and mutual learning to promote the building of a world of openness and inclusiveness, and adheres to the concept of green and low-carbon to promote the building of a clean and beautiful world. Azerbaijan stands ready to join hands with China to make concerted efforts for regional and global peace, stability, prosperity and development and to build a China-Azerbaijan community with a shared future in the new era together.

Abstract of Speech by Hasan Abdullah Al-Dajah, Jordanian Sinologist and Professor of Strategic Studies of Al-Hussein Bin Talal University



Mr. Hasan Abdullah Al-Dajah, Jordanian sinologist and professor of Strategic Studies of Al-Hussein Bin Talal University delivered a speech themed on the Future of Chinese Modernisation.

Mr. Hasan pointed out that China had embarked on the road of a large-scale modernisation and provided an Eastern mode that combines traditional and modern development. Chinese modernisation is a unique global model in the history of human development, and also a new ideology and theoretical alternative for modernisation of human society created by China with its own national wisdom. Mr. Hasan emphasised that Chinese modernisation aims at realising sustainable development in science, technology, economy, culture and other fields. Internally, China did not find its path towards poverty reduction at one stroke, but through taking continued and well-planned actions, in a bid to realise the sustainable, harmonious and green development of the country, society and the nature. Externally, the Belt and Road Initiative launched by China aims to find the common grounds between China and other countries and regional organisations, so as to achieve the new vision of common development.

Abstract of Speech by Fred Engst, American Sinologist and Professor of School of International Economics and Trade of University of International Business and Economics



Mr. Fred Engst, American sinologist and Professor of School of International Economics and Trade of University of International Business and Economics, through the perspective of economic development, illustrated the reason for China's rising and the highquality growth of China's economy and analysed the misunderstandings Western scholars currently hold about China.

According to Mr. Fred Engst, today's China is no more what it used to be. It has risen. The main reasons for its rising are that the People's Republic of China owns the right to independent development, its control of military power guarantees its autonomy in politics and economy, and it opens itself to the world under the premise of not harming its independence. As a matter of fact, China's rising has been more and more obvious since the financial crisis in 2008. So far, China's international image has improved, its economic scale has expanded substantially, and its international economic position is just next to the US, whom it also appears to be surpassing. China has become a great power that is more and more confident. The US started the trade war with an attempt to contain China who is challenging the hegemonic position of the US with its increasingly strong economic system and high technology. But the US failed to get what it wished for.

The Second World Sinology Lecture Concludes Successfully



On February 7th, the Second World Sinology Lecture themed Heritage Protection and Civilisation Inheritance co-hosted by the Chinese Association for International Understanding (CAFIU) and Beijing Language and Culture University (BLCU) was successfully held in Qingdao World Sinology Centre.

Liu Li, President of BLCU, Wang Ke, Deputy Secretary-General of CAFIU and Ding Lianpu, Deputy Director of Qingdao Education Bureau delivered speeches respectively. Niu Xiping, Vice-President of International Confucian Association, and other guests from the globe attended the event. Christoph Harbsmeier, world-famous sinologist, professor emeritus of Chinese in University of Oslo and professor of Chinese in Merton College of the University of Oxford, Thierry Melot, wellknown urban planner and founder of IFADUR SAS d'architecture, Carsten Boyer Thøgersen, well-known sinologist in Denmark and former Consul-General of Denmark in Shanghai, and Deanna Gao, famous artist, art educationalist and chairwoman of Festival du Cinema Chinois de Paris, delivered keynote speeches respectively.

In his remarks, President Liu Li said that, as a country with a time-honoured civilisation, China has rich and precious cultural heritage resources, which are the driving forces for the nation's endless growth and has enriched the spectrum of global civilisations with its own characteristics. Right now, how to inherit, protect, continue and develop these precious treasure is a global issue and is also an important aspect of Chinese modernisation.

Deputy Secretary-General Wang Ke expressed that China has always attached importance to the preservation of cultural relics and inheritance of cultural heritage. Wang hoped to take this Lecture as an important opportunity to further explore and reveal the charm of cultural heritage, revive the cultural relics and heritages and let more people from all over the world better approach cultural relics and heritages, know what kind of civilisation and country China is, and understand the significance of the Chinese civilisation for the development and progress of global civilisation, so as to make contributions to pave a broad way for the development of civilisation and human progress that "each civilisation respects its own unique beauty, and treasures the diversity of civilisations".

Prof. Christoph Harbsmeier pointed out that, the best way to protect classical Chinese texts is to analyse, explain and reveal their contemporary value to the world. Christoph Harbsmeier then presented the project Thesaurus Linguae Service (TLS) he has spent more than 30 years developing. TLS compiles a large number of ancient Chinese texts and provides detailed comparative translation. In its resourceful corpus, the semantic of every word can be systematically and hierarchically analysed, and every concept is placed in a categorical system, showing how to promote the globalisation and systematically intensive reading of classical Chinese texts. Christoph Harbsmeier mentioned that global exegesis is the core tool for ancient Chinese texts to embrace the world. The protection and development of global Chinese classics should move towards a truly diversified, scientific, theoretical and systematic path, blend in the current of world academic culture, and play an important role in the development of world academic culture. To promote the globalisation of cultural heritage conservation, it is necessary to transcend the concept of countries, broaden academic horizons and integrate Eastern and Western cultures.

With a view to the protection, utilisation, management and sustainable development of tangible cultural heritage, Mr. Thierry Melot cited the inheritance and protection of French cultural heritage as an example to interpret the philosophy, management methodology and protection measures of the historical heritages in French cities, such as strengthening government intervention and support for cultural heritages, establishing a complete legal system for cultural heritage and attracting entities such as foundations and associations to participate in the protection of cultural heritages through institutional motivation. He introduced his experience in cultural heritage protection and urban renewal and development through several cases he managed, such as the urban renewal in the old city of Lyon. Thierry Melot held that a complete protection system for cultural heritages should focus on not only the conservation and restoration, but also the combination with environmental protection, coordination with urban development and the equipment with corresponding legal system and administrative management mode. He advised that the protection of tangible urban heritages should not be limited to restoration of architectures but be expanded to a more extensive heritage development. The urban renewal should uphold the peopleoriented urban development concept, realise the discovery of urban characteristics, continuation of urban context and preservation of urban memories in the protection of cultural heritage, and constantly promote the healthy and sustainable development of cities.

Mr. Carsten Boyer Thøgersen commented on the statements about civilisation of Lin Yutang, Tcheng ki-tong and Ku Hung Ming (Tomson), three Masters of Chinese literature and great thinkers in crosscultural communication in the era of convergence of old and new knowledge. For nearly a century, these three men of letters had been committed, directly in foreign languages, to bringing Chinese culture to the world, showing the true images of China and Chinese people, and interpreting the continuity of traditional Chinese cultural thinking in the form of knowledge and the difference between logic of Chinese and Western civilisations through the cross-cultural experience of the protectors and disseminators of these traditional Chinese culture derived from the same origin. These three Chinese culture interpreters, full of confidence, had been devoted to bringing Eastern learning to the West, the counter movement of Western learning spreading to the East. Their different perspectives on the characteristics and relations of Chinese and Western cultures are of great ideological value and significance. Mr. Thøgersen pointed out that different from the preaching style of the Western culture, the Chinese culture is characterised as the relatively compatible mentality, thought, behaviour, value orientation and national character. Taking this as an example, he then explained that the exchanges of civilisation has always been a two-way impact, rather than the oneway input or output, and the healthy development of world civilisation requires the co-existence and coprosperity of diversified cultures.

Ms. Deanna Gao, whose fine brushworks on figures are delicate in colour and ink, landscape painting full of antique taste, and animal painting clever and vivid in composition, began her speech with the skills she and her students used in paintings of landscapes, figures, flowers and birds, and cats, etc. Based on her experience of years of overseas teaching and spreading Chinese painting, Ms. Gao spoke about the heritage and development of traditional Chinese painting in France. She pointed out that Chinese painting, as a painting form with traditional Chinese artistic characteristics, has evolved a grand and unique system, aesthetic ideals and forms of expression during the development of over a thousand years. It has a long history and rich cultural connotations and boasts traditional Chinese philosophy. During the cultural exchanges between China and foreign countries, traditional Chinese painting has always been one of the most important carriers of Chinese culture. The world mainstream art community acknowledges the distinctive national artistic characteristics of traditional Chinese painting, its own system established in the world painting circle and its position on the world art stage. In the current context, however, the culture and artistic forms which used to have vitality have also lost their soil for survival. The protection of painting art should be conducted based on the inheritance of skills and concepts, which are the foundation of the inheritance and innovation of traditional Chinese painting.



On January 13th, the Chinese Association for International Understanding (CAFIU) and the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES) jointly held a Webinar themed Promoting People-to-People and Cultural Exchanges and Mutual Learning among Civilisations, Enhancing Mutual Understanding and Friendship between China and Germany. Ai Ping, Vice-President of CAFIU and Former Vice-Minister of the International Department of the CPC Central Committee, delivered a speech. Representatives of NGOs and scholars from China and Germany had in-depth discussions around enhancing mutual understanding between Chinese and German people and mutual learning between Chinese and German civilisations.

In his speech, Vice-President Ai Ping emphasised that China and Germany keeping cooperation and dialogue adapts to the current of times and historical development trend, which not only serves the interests of both countries, but also makes positive contributions to the world peace and development. Friendship between the two peoples holds the key to amity between countries. Both China and Germany should actively promote cultural exchanges, strengthen people-to-people communication and deepen the mutual learning between Chinese and

German civilisations so as to enhance public support for the bilateral relationship featuring mutual respect, inclusiveness, exchanges and mutual learning between civilisations and win-win cooperation.

Professor Wu Jiang, Dean of the School of German Studies at Beijing Foreign Studies University, and Professor Zhang Ji, Associate Dean of the School of International Relations and Public Affairs and Director of China Foreign Cultural Exchange Research Centre at Fudan University, explored new measures and channels from different perspectives to enhance mutual understanding between Chinese and German people and promote exchanges and mutual learning among civilisations of China and Europe countries. Sergio Grassi, Chief Representative of FES Beijing Office, Thomas Meyer, Professor of Political Science in Dortmund University of Technology, and Thomas Heberer, Professor of Political Science and East Asia Studies in University of Duisburg-Essen agreed that people should fully respect the exploration of paths towards modernisation by different civilisations. They also pointed out that through exchanges and mutual learning among civilisations, we can enhance China-Germany and China-Europe mutual understanding and mutual respect, facilitate practical cooperation and promote a sustained and sound relationship between the two sides.

CAFIU holds a Webinar on the New Vision of China-Bosnia and Herzegovina Cooperation and Role of Civil Society



On January 17, the Chinese Association for International Understanding (CAFIU) and the Association of Bosnia-China Friendship co-hosted the webinar themed New Vision of China-Bosnia and Herzegovina Cooperation and Role of Civil Society. Representatives and scholars from both sides had indepth discussion around such topics as enhancing people-to-people exchanges and promoting exchanges and mutual learning between Eastern and Western civilisations.

In order to demonstrate the work of SIRONET in 2022 and foster consensus, we would like to share with all of you Ten highlights of SIRONET 2022.






