


fully demonstrated.

With similar experience and shared missions, we should stick to the common identity of developing countries, join hands to shoulder the responsibility of safeguarding the interests and rights of developing countries, and enhance mutual understanding and support on issues concerning our respective core interests and matters of major concern. We should coordinate and cooperate closely on major international and regional issues, contribute strengths to safeguarding and championing the common values of humanity.

Fourth, let us seek equality, commit to justice and jointly promote the reform and advancement of the **global governance system.** It is the responsibility of the world to promote global governance system towards the direction of reflecting the will and interests of most countries, especially developing countries, in a more balanced way. Under new circumstances, China and Africa should continue to strengthen coordination and cooperation in international affairs, safeguard the international system with the United Nations at its core and the international order underpinned by international law. We should stay firm in opposing new forms of bloc confrontation, opposing all forms of power politics. We should practice true multilateralism, and contribute wisdom to building a fairer and more rational global governance system.

Ladies and gentlemen, friends,

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Communist Party of China. General Secretary Xi Jinping delivered an important speech at the Ceremony Marking the Centenary of the Communist Party of China, which profoundly summarized the centenary journey of the CPC seeking happiness for the Chinese people and rejuvenation for the Chinese nation. Let us inherit the fine tradition of coordination and cooperation to provide non-governmental solutions for the reform and improvement of global governance. I wish the China-Africa People's Forum a continued success in the years to come.

We can never forget the contribution of 25,000 selfless Chinese doctors who left their hometown to Africa to provide medical services to their African brothers from 1962 until now. Some of them stayed in Africa for up to 9 years.

I remember one Chinese Doctor who went to Tanzania from Shandong Province- his name is Dr. Song Tao. I have singled out him because he went beyond a call of his duty –all the years he was in Tanzania, he was donating blood for his Tanzanian brothers and sisters.

Many other examples could show how the people have played a role in building a real community with a shared future.

We will never forget in September 2014 when doctors from China's People's Liberation Army went to Siera Leon to join hands with their Siera Leoneans brothers and sisters to combat EBOLA.

We will never forget in May 2020 when the first medical team from Chonqing flew to Algeria and Sudan to provide technical support for COVID19 treatment

On the other side, we can not forget how African students in WUHAN China during the COVID19 outbreak remained in WUHAN and faced the COVID19 pandemic with their Chinese brothers and sisters. In contrast, others run away in fear of their lives.

We can not overlook the contributions made by the African people in terms of materials and money to support their Chinese brothers and sisters during the onset of the COVID19 pandemic.

Ladies and Gentlemen: unsung heroes and heroines- THE PEOPLE- have made a significant contribution to strengthening our cooperation.

They join their compatriots who contributed their sweat, blood, and lives to build the TAZARA railway, a monument to the friendship between China and Africa. They also joined their Chinese compatriots who worked with their African brothers 50 years ago

to restore the People's Republic of China's lawful seat at the United Nations.

Excellencies:

Ladies and Gentlemen;

Distinguished Guests;

Our current generation has the sacred duty to continue that spirit. Only with such enthusiasm, we shall be able to overcome the challenges of our times.

That is why during his visit to Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania in March 2013, His Excellency President Xi Jinping stressed that and I quote "We should carry forward the TAZARA spirit, cherish and protect the traditional friendship between China and Africa, and build on past achievements while keeping up with changing circumstances to make sure that China-Africa Friendship and cooperation produce more fruitful results.

He also stressed that China and Africa have always been a community of shared destinies. He proposed China-Africa cooperation principles of sincerity, real results, affinity, and good faith.

These principles, ladies, and gentlemen have been guiding China-Africa relations. To achieve a people-centered outcome in the next FOCAC Ministerial meeting in Senegal, we must be guided by those principles.

The second area is on- China-Africa Cooperation on agricultural transformation. Here the main objective is to increase productivity. We would like to see Chinese and African experts exchange experiences to enable Africans to attain a green revolution.

The lessons from accomplished Chinese scientists such as the Late Professor Yuan Longping, who made a significant contribution to humankind by lifting millions of people from hunger through his scientific work, could be helpful in our cooperation.

We would also like to see more Chinese scholars such as Professor LI Kaimian, Cassava Expert at the CHINA ACADEMY OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES and Prof Nian Hai Soybean, an expert at South China Agricultural University, work with their African counterpart.

The third area is on China-Africa Health Cooperationhere, we would like to strengthen existing relations between Chinese and African Institutions. Tanzania enjoys relations with the Chinese Academy of Medical Science Cancer Hospital, Peking University International Hospital, Shandong Province Hospital, and FUWAI Hospital.

Through our cooperation, top experts from these hospitals have cooperated with their Tanzanian colleagues to serve the people.

We need to enhance cooperation between China and other African countries led by the people themselves, the doctors, the nurses, and the researchers.

And the LAST area is on- China-Africa SME Cooperation that will enable Chinese SMEs to supply African SMEs with machinery and technologies for processing and value addition of our natural resources.

We would like to plead with our Chinese partners to establish a special fund to support Africa's Small and medium enterprises.

Ladies and Gentlemen: If we can achieve positive results in those four areas- we will achieve our themed desire to build Solidarity and Cooperation for Common Development to Jointly Build an Even Closer China-Africa Community with a Shared Future.

It will be remiss of me If I conclude my remarks without mentioning our admiration to His Excellency President Xi Jinping.

We warmly congratulate him and through him the people of China on the 100th Anniversary of the founding of the Communist Party of China (CPC).

We will uphold and promote the common values of humanity featuring peace, development, equity, justice, democracy and freedom as the main theme of China-Africa people-to-people exchanges and cooperation in the next stage. By carrying out abundant civilization exchanges and mutual learning, we will create the "soft power" that safeguards the common interests of both sides and promotes the common pursuit of the world, providing lasting drive for civilization revival, cultural progress and further nourishing China-Africa cooperation.

- To promote experience sharing and idea exchanges

and collect non-governmental wisdom for China and Africa's common development. We will strengthen communication in governance pattern, development philosophy and humanistic tradition and pursue upgraded and improved bilateral cooperation, which will serve as a key form of China-Africa people-to-people exchanges and cooperation in the next phase. We will, through non-governmental channels, actively participate in the Global Development Initiative proposed by H.E. President Xi Jinping, and the Initiative on Partnership for Africa's Development jointly sponsored by China and Africa, so as to make new contributions to stepping up the implementation of the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

- To deepen independent exploration and practical cooperation and contribute non-governmental efforts to safeguard the common interests of developing countries. We will explore development paths suited to our national realities and protect the common interests of developing countries, which will be an important part of the people-to-people exchanges and cooperation between the two sides in the next stage. We will promote the global governance concept featuring intensive consultation, joint contribution and shared benefits and the democratization of global governance rules, which will serve as an important goal of China-Africa people-to-people exchanges and cooperation in the next stage. We will make plans and take practical actions on the non-governmental level to tackle global common problems, such as deficits of governance, trust, peace and development. We will coordinate our efforts in taking positions and actions and making concerted voices in multilateral occasions including the United Nations to move the international order and system toward a fairer and more rational direction.



African Delegates Vow to Forge Stronger Ties with China

Delegates from African countries at the Sixth China-Africa People's Forum on November 15 reiterated their long-standing friendship and commitment to forge even stronger ties with China to build a community with a shared future. The forum was held in advance of the Eighth Ministerial Conference of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation that will take place between November 29 and 30 in Dakar.

Chinese Civic Organizations Address UN Human Rights Council

Chinese non-profit organizations have addressed a session of the United Nations Human Rights Council to set out how they see themselves contributing to improving the human rights situation at home and abroad

According to a summary of their contributions distributed by China's Mission to the UN in Geneva, representatives of a broad range of civic groups spoke out on different issues, sometimes expressing frustration with international perceptions of their country.

On the coronavirus pandemic

Wu Peng, a representative of the China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, said his organization had worked in Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Ethiopia, Namibia, and Uganda to try to alleviate the impact of a crisis that is estimated to have pushed 100 million people into poverty.

Speaking on behalf of the China Human Rights Development Foundation, Yang Bochao, said its focus had been on providing vaccines and humanitarian support around the world. At least 100 countries have received a total of 480 million Chinese vaccines

On economic development

China has continued to improve access to foreign

companies, said Zhang Xiaoyu, a representative of the China Association for the Promotion of International Multinational Corporations. More than a million foreign-funded enterprises are now operating in the country and a better investment framework improves the livelihoods of workers around the world, he added.

On living standards

China has invested more than 600 billion yuan (\$930m) to implement relocation assistance for disadvantaged rural households with poor living conditions, said Zheng Ruohan, a lecturer at the Institute of Human Rights at Southwest University of Political Science and Law. Adding that those benefiting from the measures would also gain improved access to education, medical care, cultural experiences and job opportunities.

On leprosy

The number of new leprosy cases in China is predicted to fall to 200 in 2020, compared with many thousands a decade ago. Patients are treated for free and the government is working to tackle stigmatization, according to Meng Qingtao, deputy dean of the Institute of Human Rights of Southwest University of Political Science and Law.

Chinese NGOs Call for More International Efforts to Safeguard Right to Development

Some Chinese NGOs and international experts have called for more efforts from non-government sectors to help safeguard human rights during the COVID-19 pandemic, such as the right to food, education, housing and decent work.

The calls were made on Monday at a parallel event for the 47th Session of the United Nations (UN) Human Rights Council, which was held online from Beijing, about non-governmental organization (NGO)'s contribution to the right to development.

Experts on the panel pointed out that the right to development of people of all countries, developing countries in particular, is facing serious challenges.

"NGOs, as an important force in global human rights governance, can contribute to protecting the right to development," said Xu Lyuping, vice-president of China NGO Network for International Exchanges.

"We need to step up cooperation on vaccine R&D, production and distribution, so that vaccines can truly become useful and affordable public goods

for people of all countries, especially in developing countries," Xu added.

Bolat Ussenov, deputy director of China Studies Center in Kazakhstan, stressed the importance on why NGOs should develop a more cohesive identity in the world arena

"The foreign policy of individual countries is burdened with internal biases and is aimed at their interests," said Ussenov, adding "NGOs, in comparison with state bodies, have higher mobility in providing consultations, allocating material assistance to those in need."

In 1970, Kabbah Mubaye, member of the UN Commission on Human Rights, clearly put forward the concept of the "right to development."

Later in 1986, UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration on the Right to Development, establishing the right to development as a human right.



Pandemic Slowing Poverty Relief Progress: Expert

The novel coronavirus pandemic has slowed the world's progress in protecting people's economic, social and cultural rights, and the situation requires ever closer cooperation among the United Nations, countries and regions, as well as social groups, an expert said.

Wang Xingzui, executive vice-president of the China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, said at an online conference on Friday that protecting people's economic, social and cultural rights has long been a focus of the UN Human Rights Council, as it's key to the life and welfare of billions of people all over the world, especially those living in developing countries.

Addressing the conference, a parallel event of the ongoing 47th Session of the UN Human Rights Council, Wang said it is important to promote dialogue and share experiences on the protection of economic, social and cultural rights among NGOs and other stakeholders.

Somsanouk Mixay, secretary general of the Lao Committee for Peace and Solidarity, Amjad Pervaiz from the Pakistan Red Crescent Society, other Chinese and foreign experts and representatives of international NGOs participated in the event.

The COVID-19 pandemic, which is still rampant across the world, has even threatened some basic human rights including access to food, clean water, shelter and education, Wang said.

Zhang Yunfei, council member of the United Nations Association of China, said at the online conference that the pandemic has brought far-reaching impacts to economic, social and cultural rights protection.

She stressed that fulfilling the economic, social and cultural rights of people in developing countries is vital to promoting human rights around the world as the populations in developing economies account for about 80 percent of the world's total.

According to Zhang, it's extremely important for the entire international community to reach a consensus to protect people's economic, social and cultural rights, which are of vital importance to the fulfillment of all human rights.

She said that the human rights mechanism of the United Nations should pay more attention to the promotion and protection of people's economic, social and cultural rights, especially the rights to subsistence and development. The developed economies must provide financial and technological assistance to the developing ones.



Experts Reject Alleged Suppression of Ethnic Minorities

China's northwest Xinjiang region remains a top issue at the 48th session of the UN Human Rights Council. China's delegation at the session is refuting allegations of genocide, forced labor, and religious suppression. Some experts have also criticized these narratives about Xinjiang. CGTN's Feng Yilei has more.

Controversies of alleged violations against Uygurs and other minority groups in Xinjiang have risen, at the regular session of UN Human Rights Council. Researchers and activists from China, Pakistan and UK made a retort at a webinar on Friday.

CARLOS MARTINEZ Independent Researcher and Political Activist "It is deeply involved in the business of the new cold war and the militarization of the Pacific. These sources are absolutely not credible. They are organs of information warfare being deployed by the U.S. and its allies."

Some say figures about Xinjiang's development speak for themselves.

XU LYUPING Vice President China NGO Network for International Exchanges "The living standards, health and education of ethnic groups have been widely improved. Thanks to the efforts of the people of all ethnic groups. Xinjiang has been free from violent terrorist cases for more than four consecutive years."

Speakers at the conference also disclosed the situation in Xinjiang based on their own experience there.

MUHAMMAD ZAMIR ASSADI Journalist, Independent News Pakistan "I have spent a very good time in China as a journalist and experienced a high level of religious freedom for Muslims residing in various regions. I met with Muslims in various provinces of China who shared with us that the Chinese government is attaching equal importance to protecting the culture of all ethnic groups in Xinjiang, and citizens' right to freedom of religious belief is also guaranteed."

In fact, China had made it clear months ago, that it would welcome a UN visit to Xinjiang, but never an "investigation with a presumption of guilt."

PANG CHUNXUE Minister Counselor, Chinese Embassy in Pakistan "Those who tell lies on Xinjiang are aimed pursuing their own anti-China political agenda. They care nothing about facts and truth at all, nor did they actually do anything good to contribute to Xinjiang well-being."

Experts believe central Asian countries should be responsible for ending political manipulation in the name of human rights defenders.

SABAH ASLAM Executive Director Islamabad

Institute of Conflict Resolution "When it comes to our region, America or the western states that are the educators of the human rights, they forgot what is going on in India, with the minorities, what is going on in Kashmir. This is the time, the high time, that we can do maximum, because once America is out of this region, this is the time for the regional countries now to play their active role."

At a recent session of the UN Human Rights Council, some countries such as Venezuela, South Sudan and the Maldives said they were opposed to external interference in China's domestic affairs.

FENG YILEI Hami, Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region "They said China has made strides in human rights, as representatives of some ethnic minorities spoke at the session. Those from Xinjiang shared how they were lifted out of poverty and guaranteed labor rights. Chinese delegates said that unilateral measures targeting Xinjiang infringe upon people's rights and those of Chinese enterprises in the region. And they called for a stop to such infringements. Feng Yilei, CGTN, Hami in the Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region."

China an Important Contributor to Global Human Rights Progress

China has made remarkable achievements in human rights and contributed its wisdom and solutions to global human rights governance, promoting the world's human rights cause, said heads of social organizations, experts and scholars from countries including China, the United Kingdom (UK), France, Japan, Pakistan, Laos, and Venezuela.

They expressed such views at online side events at the 48th session of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC), which were held by social organizations and human rights research institutes including China Society for Human Rights Studies and China NGO Network for International Exchanges (CNIE).

Through institutional and policy guarantees, China ensures that ethnic minority citizens enjoy rights to equality and freedom and to economic, social and cultural services. China helps all ethnic minority areas accelerate their economic and cultural development, according to attendees at these side events.

China's efforts and achievements in promoting overall, comprehensive, proactive, and substantial protection of the rights of people of all ethnic groups in its Tibet autonomous region over the past 70 years since the peaceful liberation of the region have fully demonstrated socialist system's advantage and characteristic of protecting the rights of ethnic minority groups, said Yang Zongke, president of Northwest University of Political Science and Law in China.

China's experience in protecting human rights in Tibet has offered the world good examples of human rights protection, Yang said.

China's success in reducing poverty in Tibet has further guaranteed a fair and just environment







for human rights development, strengthened the capabilities of impoverished population in Tibet to take part in social and economic development and share the fruits of development, and better safeguarded the rights of residents in the region to subsistence and development, representing a historic achievement in human rights in Tibet, said Kelsang Drolma, a researcher on Tibetan economy and society with the China Tibetology Research Center.

By showing the realities of the sound economic and socialdevelopment in northwest China's Xinjiang Uygur autonomous region, participants in these side events have debunked the false allegations against the regionmade by a handful of Western countries who have attempted to smear China.

Carlos Martinez, an independent researcher and political activist from the UK, said that he hasn't seen any phenomenon of the so-called "cultural extinction" or "religious persecution" in Xinjiang during his visits to the region in recentyears. The accusation of human rights violations in Xinjiang made by certain Western countries is entirely groundless, according to him.

Muhammad Zamir Assadi, a journalist with Independent News Pakistan, said he has visited Xinjiang and had a wonderful time there. During his stay in the region, he could truly feel that the Chinese government respects the traditional culture and folk customs of the ethnic minority groups in Xinjiang very much and fully guarantees local Muslims' freedom of religious belief, according to Assadi.

Last month, China's State Council Information Office released the "Human Rights Action Plan of China (2021-2025)," the country's fourth human rights action plan. It attracted wide attention and became a hot topic at online side events.

China's fourth human rights action plan is in line with the country's social and cultural environment and shows the country's attention to safeguarding the rights of special groups and commitment to solving problems including poverty, said Sitsang khom Sisaketh, Lao deputy permanent representative to the United Nations Office at Geneva (UNOG).

China has set a good example to countries around the world by issuing and implementing the action plan, he said.

China has made significant progress in protecting human rights, said Rajmi Manatunga, first secretary of the Permanent Mission of Sri Lanka to the UNOG.

China has met the poverty eradication target set out in the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development 10 years ahead of schedule, which is particularly impressive and has a profound influence on the international community, Manatunga noted.

China's fourth human rights action plan is rich and comprehensive in content and worth recommending and encouraging, Manatunga said.

There are good practices of respecting and safeguarding human rights in different industries in China, which are worth further studying and sharing by the international community, said Bård A. Andreassen, professor of human rights at the Norwegian Centre for Human Rights, University of Oslo and research director of the research group on human rights and development at the Faculty of Law, University of Oslo.

"The Chinese government has issued four human rights action plans consecutively. It is an important manifestation of the constant development of China's human rights," said Tang Yingxia, deputy director of the human rights research centerof China's Nankai University.

A highlight of the latest human rights action plan is that it uses a whole chapter to specify people's environmental rights and enrich the connotation of environment-related human rights, which demonstrated China's high attention to the field, Tang noted.

China's NGOs Affirm Support for UN Initiatives

China's social organizations have supported the role of the United Nations and taken concrete actions to accelerate the implementation of the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, researchers and representatives from NGOs said at a webinar on Wednesday.

The webinar "United Nations and Me: Stories from NGOs" was jointly held on Wednesday by the China NGO Network for International Exchanges and the Chinese Association for International Understanding. Dozens of representatives from Chinese and foreign NGOs attended the online meeting, sharing their stories with the UN.

While the Chinese government has made great contributions to world peace and development in the past five decades, cooperation between China's NGOs and the UN has also played an important role in supporting the UN, said Yuan Zhibing, secretary-general of the CAIU.

Since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, China's nongovernmental forces have launched events to support the global fight against the virus, Yuan said. China's NGOs have also done a lot in poverty alleviation and tackling climate change.

Wu Peng, representative of the China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation, an NGO founded in 1989, said the organization has actively participated in and interacted with UN agencies since 2016 to share the Chinese experience in poverty reduction.

By the end of 2020, the organization has raised 7.83 billion yuan (\$1.2 billion) in funds, Wu said. Its "Smiling Children School Feeding" project and "Panda Pact" project were selected as the best global poverty reduction projects by seven organizations of the UN system and the World Bank in 2019 and 2021 respectively.

Ni Yao from the All-China Environment Federation said social organizations have many things to do to integrate social forces for environmental protection.

Yao called on more Chinese NGOs to work with the UN and join social organizations across the world to accelerate the implementation of the UN goal of sustainable development and stride into a better future



UN Human Rights Forum: Experts Share Judicial Experience in Promoting Democracy

At a recent UN forum, experts discussed ways in which equal access to justice is necessary for human rights, democracy and the rule of law. Some Chinese scholars who joined the forum gave insights into China's judicial system. Yang Shanshan has the story.

Professor Zhai Guoqiang is considered an expert on China's constitution

At the third session of the United Nations' Forum on Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law, he spoke of China's judicial reforms and how digitization has helped improve people's access to justice.

ZHAI GUOQIANG Deputy Director, Institute of International Law, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences "China has three very special courts, namely the internet courts in Beijing, Hangzhou and Guangzhou. If you want to go to the internet court to file a case, you can do it online. You can download all judgements there. You don't need to go to the actual court. This example of the internet court is a typical way of promoting democracy in China."

Professor Zhai believes democracy is a shared value, but one that differs from state to state. He says the different interpretations often lead to mistrust and discord among countries, and that this has become more apparent during the COVID-19 pandemic, with restrictions to movement and gatherings.

Other experts say dialogue is crucial to establishing and rebuilding trust.

ZHANG QI Assistant Research Fellow, Shanghai Institute of American Studies "I think judicial authorities, universities, think tanks and law firms in China should be encouraged to conduct seminars and exchanges to discuss and share theories and best practices with relevant personnel from other countries, especially on judicial problems caused by transnational crime, climate change, public health and other issues. Because all these problems are new challenges for everyone. They can't be solved by one country. We need cooperation among countries to deal with them "

YANG SHANSHAN Beijing "Due to the pandemic, many participants can't travel to Geneva, so they are contributing online. But this doesn't make them any less passionate about the topics. Many Chinese scholars are calling for more international judicial cooperation. They say to achieve this, countries should respect others' cultures and political systems, seek common ground rather than impose their own standards on others. Yang Shanshan, CGTN, Beijing."
